A Father's Prayer for His Seminarian Son

St. Joseph, my holy patron, pray for my son that he may cultivate the virtues of obedience, unselfishness, and self-denial. Let him know true purity, the virtue so necessary in every priest. Guard him against bad companions, and the bad example of others. Let me be an inspiration to him in this holy virtue in my speech and manner.

My Jesus, I pray for myself that I may be worthy to be the father of a priest. Keep from our home and family anything that might be a hindrance to a vocation for my son.

Bless likewise, O Lord, all those who are helping my son to attain the goal of the priesthood. Reward their efforts with Thy grace. Bless the Bishop and superiors with Thy Divine Counsel that their efforts may find a fruitful response.

Finally, O Lord, help my son to accept and do the work Thou hast assigned to him in life. Amen
